

Peel Regional Paramedic Services

Service Fact Sheet

The Region of Peel employs approximately 500 full-time, part-time and contract paramedics and approximately 70 management and administrative staff who provide life-saving, pre-hospital emergency medical care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year.

Meeting community need

- Respond to nearly 100,000 emergency calls annually
- Serve as first medical responders to emergency situations across the Region of Peel
- Deploy out of 15 stations located throughout the cities of Brampton and Mississauga and the Town of Caledon
- Care for approximately 1.4 million and a geographical area of 1,225 square kilometres using 52 ambulances at peak times (10 a.m. 10 p.m.)
- Run a fleet of 100 emergency response vehicles including Rapid Response Units and Supervisor First Response Vehicles
- Transport patients (most often) to Brampton Civic William Osler Health System, or Trillium Health Partners' Credit Valley or Mississauga hospitals.

Skills and training

- Employ approximately 320 Primary Care Paramedics (PCPs) and 170 Advanced Care Paramedics
- Complete a 2-year college program and provincial exam before beginning their career as a PCP
- Advance their medical education in pre-hospital care treatment through annual training
- Administer manual defibrillation, pain management, IV therapy and manage a wide variety of trauma
- Operate a tactical team who have specialized training to support Peel's Regional Police responding to high-risk calls (weapons calls, hostage situations, suspicious packages etc...)

Programs

- **STEMI** assess patients and consult with a Mississauga or Brampton Civic hospital cardiologist to bring the patient in for immediate heart surgery.
- CPAP treat shortness of breath in patients with lung diseases, including fluid in the lungs, using a machine to push air into the lungs, making breathing easier.
- Rapid Response Unit provides emergency care coverage in Peel using a paramedic in an SUV positioned in communities to respond to life-threatening calls, provide rapid patient assessment, and treatment
- ROC Research studies participate in studies investigating the impact of pre-hospital care on cardiac resuscitation and severe traumatic injury.

Fact Sheet: 10-year Facility Implementation Plan

- In 2007, in order to help meet Peel's growing emergency health-care needs, and with the
 goal to save lives, Regional Council chose to implement a divisional model of service for
 paramedics similar to the one police use, where paramedics will be stationed in the
 communities they serve. This decision was based on the recommendations of a health
 consultant's feasibility study on the Region's paramedic services.
- By 2017, the Region will have 25 paramedic stations. Four of these will be reporting stations and 21 will be satellite stations.
- Reporting stations are approximately 40,000 square feet; here ambulances are cleaned and restocked for shift and it's also where paramedics arrive to start work; paramedics are then sent to smaller satellite stations from which they respond to emergencies.
- Satellite stations are approximately 2,800 square feet, making it easier to place them strategically within the community to help paramedics respond to emergencies faster.
- Stations will be strategically located throughout Peel, placing paramedics closer to the people that they serve, and to improve response time to deliver life-saving treatment.
